


CIVIC BOOT CAMP RESOURCE GUIDE



Chelsea Ongaro




Chelsea Ongaro is the Public Engagement Program

Corey Holder is a transportation planner in the service planning group at King County Metro. He is currently working as the project manager for the Lynnwood Link Mobility Project, which will restructure service in North King County to better connect to the upcoming Lynnwood Link extension.

Randy Harlow



Randy Harlow is the Executive Project Director for Sound Transit's \$2.8 Billion Lynnwood Link Extension, connecting the Northgate Link Extension to the future Everett Link Extension and expanding light rail into Snohomish County on behalf of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority (Sound Transit). Prior to joining Sound Transit in mid-January of 2019, Randy led the construction management arm of WHH Nisqually Federal Services as the 8(a) firm's Executive Program Manager, a role that relied on his wide range of project experience spanning more than twenty-five years, including industrial, site/civil, residential, and infrastructure construction. Randy also previously served at the project level as the Resident Engineer for the construction phase of Sound Transit's East Link Downtown Bellevue to Spring District Heavy Civil GC/CM project, Sound Transit's first GC/CM project at the University of Washington Station, and the negotiated Airport Station. Prior to his transit work, Randy provided resident engineering services for the Port of Seattle's Landside and Stormwater silos of the Sea-Tac International Airport Capital Improvement Program, as well as projects for Kitsap County's Wastewater Improvement Program. Randy earned his Bachelor's Degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering from the University of Washington and is a licensed Professional Engineer in the State of Washington. He is a member of several industry organizations, including the Dispute Resolution Board Foundation and the American Society of Civil Engineers.
