Debate Rules & Guidelines

For the candidates / campaigns:



We encourage the candidates to treat this as a discussion, engaging with each other in exploring the issues. However, candidates will refrain from asking each other direct questions. Candidates are requested to answer the questions posed and stick to the subject of the question at hand. Candidates will refrain from leveling accusations, charges or attacks of a personal nature, or that are irrelevant to the office or issues pertaining to the office.

Moderators may interrupt any time to enforce the rules and format requirements.

If a candidate demonstrates disruptive behavior and/or repeatedly violates the rules, moderators shall have the right to stop the program, turn off the candidate's microphone and ask him/her to leave the debate. The remaining candidate shall be allowed to continue to the end of the program. Moderators will have the right to allow the expelled candidate to reenter the debate.

For the in-person audience:

- Hold all applause and other audible commentary until the end of the program.
- Silence electronic devices.
